



LETTER FROM THE MAYOR

Dear Residents,

The Thanksgiving holiday is a time to reflect. We look at all we have to be thankful for and the freedoms that we cherish; it reminds us to help others less fortunate. While an American tradition, it is one that is shared and cherished no matter where we came from.

Since 1992, the annual Harvest Drive culminates each year in November. This year-round project of Children Helping Children is the fundraising and food gathering effort of over 150 public and private schools, as well as churches, temples and community organizations to provide a complete Thanksgiving meal and a week's worth of groceries and necessities to over 2000 food insecure families. The Harvest Drive was initiated at Country Isles Elementary School right here in Weston. In the spirit of Thanksgiving, we would encourage you to do what you can, if you can, to help children help other children in need; please visit www.harvestdriveflorida.com.

While the calendar year has not yet come to an end, the city's fiscal year has. A new budget was adopted with no increase in the City millage rate. The ad valorem rate is also still the lowest in Broward County. It remains unchanged at 2.3900 and we are proud to tell you that it will maintain the same level of quality services that Weston residents have come to enjoy and expect.

Our events season is in full swing and runs through May 2016. The City, in conjunction with the Arts Council of Greater Weston, will offer many great events for families. These include the monthly Moonlight Movies in the Park series, performing arts programs for children at the Weston Community Center, Symphony of the Americas concerts - both ticketed and free, the new WestonNights Outdoor Concert series, a Winter Safety Expo, the Celebrate the Arts event, Weston WorldFest, the Royal Egg Hunt, and much more. Activities such as the Mayor's Get Fit Challenge Cup 1-Mile Walk give families the opportunity to focus on fitness. Please look for details of these and other events on our City website at Westonfl.org/Events.

Lastly, I will end on the suggestion of vigilance to not leave valuables in sight in vehicles, and to always, always lock your car doors. 23rd Anniversary of Children Helping Children & Families Stamp Out Hunger

ack in 1992, Renée Herman took it upon herself to organize a food drive at Country Isles Elementary that would provide a week's worth of groceries to 20 Weston area families who were down on their luck. She rallied the students to help with neighborhood canned food drives and camped outside of Publix Supermarkets to accept donations. They succeeded and the 20 families in need were fed. But she didn't stop there. Twenty-three years later, Renée is still on a mission to stamp out hunger and help families in need.

Since the inaugural Harvest Drive, the number of families in need multiplied, as did the amount of help required to accomplish such a task. After many years of orchestrating the details of this annual event, Renée has been blessed with several special people to assist her in her efforts. Kim O'Neill, Susan Gross, Davi Leoniff, Jodi Samson and Amy Freund all volunteer to share the responsibilities. "It takes thousands of people to make this happen every year. Organizations such as the Rotary Club of Weston and Plantation Rotary have been instrumental in helping with donations and money to buy groceries. Businesses such as The Castle Group help with a tremendous amount of volunteers. Individuals such as Jim Norton, Michael Freedland, Steve Goldstein and Robert Harms among many others, have been life savers in the 11th hour when we did not have enough food for the promised families," said Renée.

Another unique characteristic of the program is the compassion and dedication displayed each year by students who contribute. "What really

makes this work, what is really special about Harvest Drive, is that it is the students and the schools that gather what we need and volunteer their time to make this a reality," she says. Many of the students volunteer every year and she has formed a lasting bond with them throughout her time organizing the Harvest Drive. "Teaching children at an early age that their contributions can make a difference in the lives of others is what makes this project so rewarding," Renée adds. Not only does this make the hard work and sacrifice pay off, it gives her hope for the future and inspires her to do even more.

This year, over 200 public and private schools are involved in the mission to collect enough food to feed over 2,200 families throughout Broward County. Distribution sites will be set up at 13 local schools, with Western High School being the largest. In addition to these sites, approximately 198 other schools will be taking donations that will then be divided up between the area distribution sites.

Families with children in Broward County Schools are referred to the Harvest Drive by Broward County social workers as well as other local social service agencies based on their financial need. In addition to the week's worth of groceries and Thanksgiving dinner, families are able to shop in the Harvest Drive's makeshift stores for a variety of household items that have been donated. Volunteers work all year long collecting donations for the "Harvest Drive Boutiques" so that these families may find things they need at no cost to them. Western High, Pompano High and Westglades Middle School will be fully stocked with items such as toiletries, shoes, gently used toys, dothes and books; items that many of us may take for granted are most in need by these families.

"What keeps me awake at night worrying is that the day before the families arrive that week before Thanksgiving, we will be short. We need cash donations so we can buy the items we are short at the last minute. I cannot bear the thought that our local, neighborhood families will go hungry when so many individuals, businesses and organizations have so much to give," she said. Herman does not comprehend

No one gets paid to run this organization," Renée says. "We need more help. Hunger is a year round challenge."



Savannah's Soldiers Says "Thank You" to Our Troops

housands of men and women are abroad fighting for our country 24/7. Fourteen-year-old Savannah Maddison of Weston understands how much a simple letter can mean to the soldiers, who are separated from family, friends and loved ones. In 2011, she started Savannah's Soldiers, a letter writing campaign to encourage kids across America to write letters of encouragement to our troops. Her organization has already mailed more than 100,000 letters. She recently won a \$1,000 scholarship from Kohl's Department Stores for her efforts.

"Freedom is something that we do not think about often as kids living in the United States, but there are many men and women who leave their families behind to allow us the freedoms that we enjoy here," said Savannah. "We need to support our troops even if just with a letter. We need to let them know that we support them and are thankful for their service to our wonderful country."

Savannah started the organization after her best friend's dad was deployed. Since she loves to sing, she wrote him a deployment song. She quickly realized that she wanted to more, so she adopted his Army unit and committed to sending all 700 of them one letter a month until they returned from Afghanistan. Savannah's Soldiers has continued to evolve into much more and now sends letters all over the world and to all branches of the military.

Savannah encourages both children and adults to participate by setting up letter writing tables at events and getting the word out through a variety of venues. She partners with hundreds of schools and organizations across the country, as well as many major sports teams, such as Miami Marlins, Florida Panthers, Miami Heat, Dallas Mavericks, and Boston Red Sox. She organizes a national art competition called "Made in America" to collect artwork from kids. She reaches out to the media and has been featured in places like TODAY, Fox and Friends, Larry King Now, NY Daily News, Huffington Post, Time for Kids magazine, and more. She also speaks and performs for thousands of kids every month to motivate them to follow their dreams.

"I look forward to the day when every school and organization in the country is working with us," said Savannah. "We all have the ability to give back in some capacity and I truly believe that you are never too young to make a difference. Getting involved in community service makes the world a better place. I encourage everyone to join me on my mission to change the world."

The troops often show their gratitude by writing a message on the Savannah's Soldiers Facebook page, sending a letter or even stopping by the office in person. "The responses are my favorite part," said Savannah. "Sometimes I even get to interview the service men and women that received our letters after they have returned home. I love that!"

Savannah recently received a \$1,000 Kohl's Cares Scholarship to be used toward higher education for the positive impact her volunteer efforts have had on the community. Only 200 of the more than 32,000 nominees that applied nationwide received regional scholarships. "Kohl's is thrilled to recognize this year's winners of the Kohl's Cares Scholarship Program, and we applaud their efforts to better the communities in which they live," said Bevin Bailis, Kohl's senior vice president of communications and public relations. "It is an honor to support these students as they pursue higher education and continue to inspire all of us to serve others."

In addition to community service, Savannah is also passionate about singing, performing and writing music. When she graduates, she hopes to perform around the world.



Brian Piccolo Parkis Velodrome Offersa Safe Place for Ridling and In-Iline Skatling By Debby Teich

here is only one velodrome in Florida and it is right here in Broward County. Located at Brian Piccolo Park, the facility attracts more than 3,500 athletes annually and is used for both competitive and recreational cycling, as well as in-line skating. It also hosts a variety of races for riders of all ages and abilities.

The velodrome opened in March 1992 and hosted its first major race a year later. It is a banked oval track for bicycle racing. The competitive track is 333.3 meters long with maximum banking of approximately 30 degrees at the apex of each turn. The recreational track is 200 meters long and has a maximum 10-degree banking at each end. Bright lights allow cyclists to ride safely after dark.

"Riding on a velodrome gives you a sense of speed, safety, and exhilaration," said Carl Sundquist, an accomplished rider who works for the Florida Velodrome Association. "Velodromes were created as racing venues. If you ride with a group on the velodrome, your sense of speed and the visceral feeling of going faster than you felt possible will make you feel exalted. Because they are designed exclusively for use by bicycles, you can focus on your riding with none of the concerns of riding on city streets."

Riders must use the proper bikes for velodrome cycling. Since the bikes do not have multiple gears or brakes, they help maximize speed, reduce weight, and avoid sudden braking. They are available for rent at the facility, along with other necessary equipment. Helmets are also required when riding the track. Cyclists with other types of bikes can use the Brian Piccolo Road Course, which is adjacent to the velodrome and has a paved course with 500 and 800-meter loops.


Anyone can ride at the velodrome Monday to Friday, from 3:15pm to 9:45pm; Saturday, from 8am to 9:45pm; and Sunday/holidays, from 8am to 7:30pm. Several types of riders use the facility. Some enjoy traditional bicycle racing, while others are triathletes or part of the "fixie" group that rides single speed, fixed gear bicycles. Many riders also use the velodrome for easy riding at less than race speeds and without any racing interests, because it is a safe place to ride. On Monday nights, from 6:30pm to 9pm, weather permitting, new riders can learn the basics of how to ride comfortably on the track, as well as how to ride with other riders on the track.

From November to March, the velodrome will host several races. The Florida Junior State Championships (ages 10-18) will be held November 14-15. The fall racing series will be held on Saturday afternoons, at 5pm, on November 7, 14, 21, and at 4pm on December 5 and 12. The winter racing series, which begins in January, will also be held on Saturdays. Racing is broken down into three groups based on relative experience and fitness so new riders do not have to feel intimidated by competing with experienced, highly fit riders. All of the Saturday race series will have three races for each of the three groups. Riders typically ride all three of the races in their group.

There is a family atmosphere at the races. Riders are very supportive of each other, and friends and families love to watch. "A velodrome is unique in bicycle

racing," said Sundquist. "In a road race or mountain bike race, spectators can only see the riders flash by for a second or two. In the velodrome, every seat and viewing point shows the entire track, so the spectators' viewing experience includes non-stop action."

Sundquist is one of the frequent riders at the velodrome. Since he started racing in 1982, he has been second in the world championships, a member of the 1988 and 1992 Olympic teams, and won 18 national championships. "At age 54, I am still racing and can't see stopping," said Sundquist. "There is so much I love about riding, including the sense of freedom, accomplishment and competition. I feel connected to my surroundings. I love how I feel when I am worn out after a good hard ride."

More than 2,100 amateur Jewish athletes from 36 countries participated in the 2015 European Maccabi Games in Berlin, Germany this past summer. During the 8-day Olympics-style competition, they had an opportunity to test their strength and endurance while they created long-lasting friendships. Many of the athletes were from West Broward.

Team USA consisted of 168 athletes, primarily between 15 and 25 years old. They participated on 20 teams and competed in 14 sports: Badminton, Basketball, Bridge, Chess, Equestrian-Dressage, Fencing, Field Hockey, Golf, Half Marathon, Soccer, Swimming, Table Tennis, Tennis and Water Polo.

Some of the USA team members from the grea included:

- Open Men's Basketball: Ross Udine, Weston
- Youth Men's Soccer: Jake Fuhrman and Ilan Naibryf, Weston
- Junior Boys' Basketball: Harrison Arnberg and Michael Egozi, Weston
- Junior Boys' Swimming: Elad Fraiman, Davie
- Open Men's Water Polo: Tomas Tussie, Weston

The games, however, were about much more than just athletics. They also stood for tolerance and world peace and against anti-Semitism and racism. They were filled with emotion and symbolism. It was no coincidence that the opening ceremonies took place in Berlin's Olympic Park, which was built for the 1936 Olympics, when Jewish athletes were excluded from participating. This same Olympics also served as a showcase for Hitler's rise to power in Germany.

Jake Fuhrman was captain of the USA Youth Men's Soccer team. He is currently a senior at Cypress Bay High School. Since his freshman year, he has been a starter on the boys' soccer team, which was ranked best in the state in 2013 and 2015. Some of Fuhrman's soccer accolades include All County Soccer (2015) and Boys All County Soccer (2013). He is hoping to play soccer at the college level.

In Berlin, his team's roster consisted of 16 players, including Ilan Naibryf of Weston. After beating Germany, the team lost in the Bronze Medal Match to Sweden (1-0).

"I've been lucky enough to play soccer in roughly ten different states around the USA participating in showcases, camps and league games, but nothing compares to this," said Fuhrman. "This definitely was the experience of a lifetime. It was an amazing opportunity

to represent my country and travel the world at the same time. It was interesting seeing the different styles of play from other countries. I made many new friends and we played at one of the best facilities in the world against teams from all over Europe."

Ross Udine played on the UŠA Open Men's Basketball team. Udine is currently a sophomore at New York University, where he plays point guard for the men's basketball team. In 2014, he graduated from Cypress Bay High School, where he helped lead the Lightning Boys Basketball team to three district championships. As a senior, he was named First Team All-County and Third Team All-State; selected to the Dade/Broward All-Star Game and the Big Eight All-Tournament Team.

In Berlin, he was part of a 12-man team that included a few pros and several highlevel college players. Although they were only together a couple of weeks, Udine says that the team really bonded. The squad posted a 4-1 record and came away with the Silver Medal after falling to Russia in the Gold Medal Game.

"Playing basketball for the USA Maccabi Team was an absolutely remarkable experience," said Udine. "To be able to represent your country and religion in such an iconic and historical event was a blessing. Being invited to participate in these games, especially in a place so historically significant to the Jewish people as Berlin, was an honor and I am so thankful for the opportunity. I had an amazing time with my teammates, coaches and family. Being in Germany with all of these amazing people from different countries was truly a life-changing experience that I will never forget."

Harrison Arnberg and Michael Egozi played on the Junior Boys' Basketball team, which beat Israel in the Gold medal game (83-70). "The games were an all around amazing experience, between meeting people from other countries and competing in international basketball," said Arnberg, who is a sophomore at American Heritage School. "We practiced at the Charlottenberg Sporthalle," said Egozi, who is a sophomore at Pine Crest School. "We stood at center court with our eyes closed and imagined what it would feel like to have returned to Germany in triumph and have a Gold medal placed around our necks."

Two other local athletes also played well. Tomas Tussie played on the Open Men's Water Polo team, which beat Germany (16-3) in the Bronze Medal game. Elad Fraiman was a member of the Junior Boys' Swimming team. He won a Gold medal in the 200m Medley; Silver medal in the 100m Backstroke; and Bronze medal in the 50m Breaststroke.

Freddie Sultan was only seven years old when he began to develop a passion for baseball. After years of dedication and hard work, the Weston resident is well on his way to achieving his dream of playing professional baseball. He currently attends Winthrop University in Rock Hill, South Carolina, where he is a left-handed pitcher for the Winthrop Eagles.

"It took only one season to realize that this was what I wanted to be," said Freddie. "I dropped everything else and focused solely on baseball. I watched games on television; attended high school, college and pro games; and studied teaching videos on hitting, so I could learn how to beat the batters at their own game. I grew to love the challenge of the game, my teammates, the demands of my coaches, travelling to play other teams, and the time I spent with my Dad."

Freddie started playing coach pitch baseball in the fall of 2003. By the spring of 2004, he was already playing travel baseball with the Weston Rattlers. In 2007, his 10U Weston Rattlers team won second place in the AABC Willie Mays World Series in Cantano, Puerto Rico. In 2009, he played with the USA Travel Baseball Club 12U team that won Cooperstown Dreams Park in Cooperstown, New York, and in 2010 he played on the Weston Hawks 14U team that won the USSSA Fall Nationals in Orlando, Florida.

Once in high school, he played two years of JV baseball at Cypress Bay High School and University School at NSU and then two years of varsity baseball at University School. He spent three summers playing High School Elite Ball with the South Florida Elite Squad. During his junior summer, he played with the Elite Squad in the 16U Perfect Game World Series in Goodyear, Arizona and finished runner-up. As a senior, he earned First Team All-County Honors as a pitcher. Winthrop University, which plays in The Big South Conference, also extended him an offer, which included an academic scholarship, and he committed to play for their baseball team.

"I was very happy (and relieved) to receive an offer from a great baseball program like Winthrop," said Freddie. "The college recruiting process is rigorous. There's a lot of good competition out there, but as long as you work hard to be a good player and even a better student, there's almost always a school that will want you. My goal was to play D1 baseball and, in the end, it was Winthrop that believed in me."

Last year, the Eagles went 40-19 for the season. The team made it to the semi-finals in the Big South Conference Tournament and finished the season with a 14 game conference winning streak. As a freshman, Freddie played in 20 games and pitched 38 innings (recording 31 strike outs to just 12 walks). He started several games and ended the season with a winning record and one save. Over the summer, he was invited to play in the Florida League in Central Florida, which is affiliated with Major League Baseball.

Some things about the game have not changed since he was a kid. Freddie continues to wear #35, for his favorite lefty pitcher, Dontrell Willis, who helped the Florida Marlins win their second World Series in 2003. The level of competition and camaraderie, however, is more intense than ever. "At this level, everyone is so amazingly good," said Freddie. "Every hitter in the line-up is like facing the best hitter on a high school team. Everyone is very mature in their approach, their attitude and their forward thinking. Everything I do now and am surrounded by is like pro ball."

In addition to baseball, Freddie is also committed to academics. He is currently majoring in business, with a concentration in finance. He finished his freshman year with a 3.45 GPA and made the Dean's list. "Growing up, I was always told to work hard in school, because when you have good grades everything else comes easier and with less pressure," said Freddie. "I understand that there will be life after baseball. I'm in school to get my degree and to obtain a higher education, which is something that once I earn, can never be taken away from me."

Ultimately, Freddie hopes to earn his way into the pros (Minor Leagues) for any team, but he recognizes that it is not entirely in his hands. "I can only do what I can control," said Freddie. "Hopefully, someone will give me the same opportunity that Winthrop did. The path is simple - play well and they will find you! Only time will tell. As is well stated in the movie "Moneyball," one never knows when the game is going to tell you that it's over. I'm just making the most of my opportunity and enjoying the ride every step of the way."

If Freddie does not get drafted, he plans to pursue a graduate degree or go to law school. "Whatever I do, I will work hard and do my best," said Freddie. "In the long run, I would love to have a family of my own and help my children pursue their dreams like my parents have helped me."



FOR ALL AGES AND ABILITIES

Pickleball is one of the fastest growing recreational sports in America. The game, which combines Ping-Pong, tennis, and badminton, has been popular with area residents since it was introduced in an outdoor hockey rink at Pine Island Park in 2013. After some recent renovations, the park now has six permanent courts, making it one of the premier Pickleball facilities in the state. It offers open play, as well as leagues and tournaments.

"Pickleball is a fun sport that can be played by individuals of all fitness and skill levels," said Jeff Pohlman, Operations Management Professional for the Town of Davie. "It provides you with a great cardio workout, socialization, and fun!"

Pickleball is easy for beginners to learn, but can develop into a quick, fast-paced, competitive game for experienced players. It can be played either as singles or doubles. Players use a baseball sized whiffle ball and a paddle on a court that is approximately one-third the size of a tennis court. They volley the ball back and forth to score on the opposing team. Players must learn a unique set of Pickleball terms, such as "dillball, flabjack, voll3y llama, falafel, oPA! and pickledome."

In 1965, U.S. Congressman Joel Pritchard, William Bell, and Barney McCallum created Pickleball to provide a sport for the entire family. They named it after Pickles, the family dog that would chase stray balls and then hide in the bushes. Initially, families played Pickleball in their backyards, on driveways, and on residential dead-end streets. In the mid-1970's, it grew into a game played on a paddle court with formalized rules.

The sport currently has over 400,000 players in the United States and many of them are in South Florida. There is even a USA Pickleball Association (USAPA), as well as tournaments and competitions. Pickleball was designed to be easy to learn and play whether you're five, eighty-five or somewhere in between. It has become very popular among active senior adults, as well as among high schools and college students.

The courts at Pine Island Park are available daily for Drop-In Open Play, from 9am to 9pm, except during scheduled League Play. Players should bring their own paddles and balls. They can also borrow a paddle from the Multi-Purpose Center. There is a "Challenge Court" system on all of the courts during Open Play. When a team loses they must come off the court if "Challengers" have placed their paddles in the designated area. The "Challengers" then play the winners of the previous game.

Organized Drop-in Play is offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays, from 5pm to 9pm, and Saturdays, from 8am to noon. Fifteen to 25 players from around the area typically gather to play pick-up games. Everyone is welcome, including individuals who have never played the game.

"We have beginners, intermediate, and advanced players," said Pohlman. "Individuals that use our courts are always happy to teach and introduce Pickleball to new players and beginners. There is a true sense of community on our courts."


On Wednesdays, players can join the Co-Ed PickleBall League. The next league will begin in January. It will run for 10 weeks, using a Round Robin format, followed by a single elimination tournament. If there are more than 10 teams, organizers will split the league in to multiple divisions based on skill level to create an even playing field. All matches will be played at 6pm and 7pm. Each match is a best of three games and all three games will be to 11 points. Registration is \$20 per person/\$40 per team and includes a league T-Shirt. There will be awards for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.

"Pickleball is so much fun," said Harriett Weinstein, who switched from tennis to Pickleball after her 73rd birthday. "It is a great workout and very social. I play with my grandchildren and we have a great time together."

SKYDIVING.....

THE moment, MY moment, was when the plane door opened at 10,000 feet with a huge steady blast of wind that brought so much welcomed noise into my head. Fifteen minutes prior, five of us which included my older daughter Taylor, a pilot, two instructors and me, crammed into a tiny plane and took off over Lake Okeechobee. Taking it all in, there was only a deep but steady hum of the engine slowly climbing to altitude, plenty of time for my mind to prepare itself for what it thought was to come. The instructors were clicking off hundreds of photos of us with the GoPros that were strapped to their arms. Many what if's, many projections of what I imagined the jump would be like, and many images from skydiving videos were bouncing around my head like bursting popcorn.

When I got the "it's time" tap from my tandem skydiving instructor, Eric, he put my goggles snugly over my eyes and connected me to him with many heavy-duty hooks. He then pulled the harness straps to squish us together in a spooning position. I was genuinely comforted by how tightly we were bound together. I remembered one thing that the ground instructor said to us before we got on the plane; I am not jumping out, he is going to roll us out. That was a relief as well, as I am not sure my brain could have told me "Now!" Then the door opened.

The switch flipped in my head. I went from being in the moment, ready to check off this highly anticipated, thrilling "bucket list" event to having only what could be explained as an out of body experience. My heart wasn't racing, the second thoughts I may have had were gone, but my hand was strangling the strap in the plane above my head. I looked over my shoulder one last time at Taylor who was jumping right after me, but no words came, not that she could have heard me. I looked down towards

Robotically,
I did exactly
what the
instructor said,

"Right foot out onto the step, left foot onto the step, smile at the camera, give a thumbs up, 3, 2, 1..." and we rolled out of this perfectly good plane.

Free falling at 100mph, face flapping, holding onto my chest straps for dear life, as if that might have helped if things went wrong, I watched myself careen towards the ground. I forgot everything they told me to do like arch my back and put my head back. There was no time to think, no time to feel, I was not sure if I was even breathing. Eric told me to put my arms out like I was flying, smile for the camera and give more thumbs up. Apparently I did just that according to the photos you see here on this spread. He later told me that we were free falling for 35 - 40 seconds, but it seemed like a split second.

Just before he pulled the chute cord, Eric motioned for me to pull in my arms and hold onto the chest straps, which I was more that happy to do. I heard the pop of the chute catching the wind and we catapulted with a strong jolt up, up, up. All at once, it was alarmingly quiet again, just a soft whoosh of the wind and ruffling of the chute. I was back in the moment, back into my "bucket list" moment. He said I could put my goggles around my neck. He pointed at Taylor's chute up above us, I was so happy to see her floating safely down. I saw the airport landing strip below; I saw a flock of egrets flying in formation over Lake Okeechobee; I saw a plane in the distance. I knew I would never look out of a plane window the same way again after today.

Floating on the wind currents, I was whooping and awwwing and using words like "unreal", "what a rush", "incredible". I could see my younger daughter, Cara, in her bright pink sweatshirt on the ground taking photos of us as we lofted overhead. Eric pulled a toggle on the right and we swooped into a right circle, losing altitude too quickly for my comfort zone. I was more scared at the moment than at the jump moment. My equilibrium went screwy and I got a little dizzy. He then more gently pulled the left toggle and we glided over the hangar. Coming in at what seemed to me to be too fast, he told me to bend my knees and lift my legs. At the last second he did something that made us swing up a bit to slide our butts gently onto the very welcoming earth below.

Hugs, photos, smiles...relief, as I watched my older daughter coast into her landing safely. More hugs, photos and smiles...and now angst. It was Cara's turn. She wanted to go up on the second session, so she was about to prepare for a jump with a complete stranger. My brave girl. I was both excited for her and incredibly nervous as I madly snapped off dozens of pictures of her. She suited up with harness and loaded into the plane. "What kind of mother am 1?" I was thinking half laughing and half horrified.

After fifteen minutes, the ground instructor pointed to the plane above the clouds and said, "There they are! See that little spec? That is Cara in mid jump!" The time from seeing her jump to when her chute opened seemed like 20 minutes. It is funny how different perspectives view the same event. As she neared the ground, I heard her holler and whoop and watched her wave as she soared above. I am not going to lie, I was happy the whole thing was over. I took a huge sigh of relief when all three of us were finally safe on the ground.

In the 20 minues after, we viewed our photos, laughed and shared our thoughts and persepectives

She felt that a second jump would be a more memorable experience. Taylor and I were content with our first, and likely last, jump out of a plane. Mission accomplished...one more thing checked off the bucket list!

Perhaps Cara will go again someday. Perhaps all three of us will be a little more adventurous in the future because we will look at things from this new perspective. As far as creating life long memories, this was a great way to celebrate all three of our birthdays; ages 49, 23, and 20. The grass looked greener, the sky looked bluer and we all felt a little more alive on the drive home.

ami Nix Rahn is a visual artist with a degree in Fine Arts. As president of the Arts Council of Greater Weston, Inc., she is sharing her passion with other Weston residents by providing diverse arts and culture events and activities for kids and adults of all ages in an effort to help build the community through the arts. "Art impacts a community in so many ways - esthetically, financially, and spiritually," said Rahn, who has been a member of the Council for the past five years. "Weston is a multicultural, family-oriented community. The Arts Council works to bring shared aesthetic experiences that unite us all in an esprit de corps."

The Arts Council is an independent, volunteer, nonprofit organization that serves as a liaison between the community, the City of Weston and the Broward County Cultural Affairs Division. The board includes 15 local business leaders, arts advocates and retired professionals that advocate and promote arts and culture events, and also review event requests for recommendations to the City Commission. It is not necessary to be on the board to volunteer.





34 lb. Ground Organic Chicken
1/2 lb. Organic Chicken Sausage, assings removed

If a student earns over 250 service hours from 8th grade graduation through high school graduation, they would be eligible to wear a silver cord during their graduation ceremony. As a parent, you can help your child find organizations and places to volunteer and hopefully become engaged in. Here are some areas where local teens have developed a strong tie:

- Habitat for Humanity
- ARC Broward County and City Parks
- Beach Clean Up Projects
- Broward Outreach Center

"We are hoping the requirement for service hours sparks interest in helping others, not just who can earn the most hours," said South Plantation High School Principal Christine Henschel.

Students can also take an initiative and create their OWN service projects. Here are some ideas your child may be interested in:

- Book Drive. Begin collecting books from everyone you know. Start a library in one elementary class. Maybe go to your favorite elementary teacher that you had and ask them if you can create a library for them in their room.
- 2. Park clean up. You can gather a few friends and help clean up ANY park. Just think of the impact you could make if you went to ONE park for ONE hour each weekend.

- 3. Coat drive. So many students in Broward County do not have cool weather clothing due to our warm weather. When we do have a cold snap, there are thousands of students who do not have proper clothing. You could collect jackets and sweaters from families for each social worker in the public schools.
- 4. Snack drive. Collect boxes of snacks for the social workers in the public schools to keep in their office. They know the students who need the food and usually can set up something for students in need to come by their office each Friday to take some snacks with them so they have food on the weekends.
- 5. Coach a sport. Be a volunteer coach for any team. Helping other children counts toward your service hours. Help out in any area you are strongest in. You can check in your city to help with city leagues, but there are also several county leagues that help children with special needs learn to play sports.

As the school year at the Bay rolled in, students soon found that the traditional media center they have always known acquired a summer upgrade. The new cyber lounge. The Wave," offers a wide range of technological features for students to utilize and pair. their own electronic devices with. Principal Scott Neely had envisioned a facility in which students would be able to embrace the new way of learning through technology. "Mr. Neely wanted the cyber lounge to be able to do those things that the kids are doing now with all the new technology that they have," Assistant Principal Marianela Estripeaut said.

Most tables have outlets directly connected to them, which provide a place for students to charge their phone, tablet, or other electronic devices. "I think students are used to using technology all the time and it has become second nature to them, so a facility such as the new cyber lounge is going to encourage more students to come in and enjoy all the technology," Media Clerk, Lina Agosta said. Even the chairs have the ability to move quickly so when the students are working in groups they can regroup easily and work with someone else. The high-top tables have the capability to connect a tablet or laptop to and then cast what is on the device on to a larger computer screen. Similarly, there is a conference area, which offers tablets for use during a seminar or meeting.

"It was a beautiful media center before, with nice furniture and everything, but it didn't have the capabilities the new one has," Estripeaut said. Principal Neely wanted the cyber lounge to feel modern and retro with a different look and vibe than the previous media center. "If you notice the furniture that it is in there, it all has a specific purpose." Estripeaut said. The furniture is not only functional, but has gotten a great response aesthetically. "When I first saw 'The Wave,' my mind was blown. I would not expect the library to improve and look as nice as it does now," senior Rueben Cubas Bazan said. Bazan said that last year he had used the media center for studying and homework and he was impressed with its new look when he first found out about the renovations through a Snapchat.

"The transition to the new facility did not take that long. We met with a county-approved vendor regarding the furniture and we worked out the little intricacies," Estripeaut said. There were several stages involved in planning the new cyber lounge including picking the exact materials, as well as flooring and wall color. "After we figured out what we wanted it to look like,

we got to the fun stage, which is deciding on the little decorative accents," Estripeaut said. You see these decorative accents as soon as you walk in. One being the large, ornamental decal that says "The Wave" contrasted against a gray wall. Even the windows over looking the planning rooms are decorated to look like a huge fish tank.



"When I first saw the cyber lounge I was impressed because I didn't expect that they would decorate or upgrade it this much. A technology-focused school and Internet access gives you unlimited resources, but at the same time keeping some of the books was also a pretty good idea," senior Juan Cuartas said. Most hard cover books that are still readily available and in the cyber lounge are non-fiction. "The shift towards more computers and less books has been an easy transition and my roles and responsibilities haven't really changed," Media Clerk, Terri Nelson said.

Estripeaut believes that "once you go forwards, you can't go back." However, she does not think that means that students will never pick up a hard cover book again. "I think that you have to change with the times. Sometimes we hold on to the old way of doing things when it's inevitable that change comes along and change is here. Students read a lot of texts through their electronic devices. We can't prevent that from happening," Estripeaut said.

Agosto said she thinks more students will be interested in coming in to study or to download because it's something that they are used to. "We wanted the name to reflect the electronic flow and wave of information," Estripeaut said. "We went through several different names and obviously Mr. Neely is a surfer and the surfing theme permeates the school." The electronic flow and wave of information are things that the facility represents. "I don't think the name could suit it an better," Cuartas said.

The overall response to the catchy title and new addition to the large school has been positive. "I think the students are going to absolutely be thrilled with it," Estripeaut said. "I think it's beautiful that what he had in his mind is now becoming a reality."

Eagle Point Elementary is thrilled to announce that our Dual Language Program has expanded this year to include third grade. EPE was the first public school in Broward County to implement the innovative two-way immersion (TWI) model two years ago. The program features half of each day in which English-only is spoken and the other half of the day where Spanish-only is spoken. All content areas are presented in both languages, with non-repetitive lessons that enhance delivery of the targeted skills. This TWI model is highly compatible with the Florida Standards (FS). Early success and increasing demand enabled the English-Spanish program to grow one grade each year since the kindergarten and first grade inception. Ultimately, the TWI classes will be offered in kindergarten through fifth grades.

Two years into the TWI program, our third grade dual language students are currently reading a chapter book in Spanish and engaged in recreating experiences from the main character's life. The book, Judy Moody Está Mal Humor, de Muy Mal Humor, is about a spirited third grader. Projects include creating a Me collage and taking care of a pet Venus flytrap. This thematic, multidisciplinary unit is an ideal example of integrating standards with Spanish literacy in a relevant and engaging format that supports our dual language curriculum.

With Hispanic Heritage Month quickly approaching from September 15 to October 15, all of our dual language students are getting excited about the planned projects and events. Kindergartners are dressing a figure to represent their parents' heritage. First graders are conducting research on Hispanic countries to learn all about the culture and will compose research reports. Second graders are designing luggage that represents the country of their families' heritage and will dress in traditional costumes. Third graders are researching Hispanic Nobel Peace Prize winners and will present multimedia reports. All EPE students will participate in school-wide events such as a paella lunch and salsa dancing lessons.

Eagle Point's dual language program upholds the school's mission to empower students to become leaders with a passion for lifelong learning. EPE staff and families are proud to support bilingual, biliterate, and bicultural experiences that nurture global citizenship. Each year our staff votes on a theme and this year was no exception. Our theme for 2015-2016 is "Manatee Bay Elementary, where Superheroes are made."


